The DLM Forum is seeking contributions for our next members' meeting, to be held at the headquarters of the National Archives of Hungary in the magnificent castle district in Budapest on 4-5 November 2024. The theme of the meeting is "DLM Forum: 30 Years of Digital Information Management – Looking Ahead and Learning from the past."

The DLM Forum now has 30 years of experience working as a community dedicated to digital information governance in a European context. Our upcoming members' meeting in Budapest will celebrate what we have achieved together so far – bringing old and new members together – as well as look ahead to the future and its challenges.

The DLM Forum is the story of European Information Governance since 1994. DLM Forum members' meetings are opportunities for networking and promoting new projects and ideas dealing with aspects of digital transformation. In 1994, when the DLM Forum started, the World Wide Web had about 10,000 websites and 2 million computers were online. The DLM Forum began investigating, promoting, and implementing possibilities for wider cooperation in the field of electronic archives and information governance both between the member states and at the EU level.

For the members' meeting in Budapest, we are looking for both 20-minute presentations and ideas for workshops of up to an hour related to the following themes:

- Reflections from the history to the future
- Practical experiences in digital transformation
- Experiments with new technologies and data innovation

The DLM Forum provides a unique opportunity to discuss digital, data, records, and archiving, reaching out to one another and exploring cooperation opportunities.

The event will mainly take place onsite, i.e., contributors are expected to be present in Budapest. Please note that DLM Forum does not reimburse speakers for their travel expenses or pay any performer's fees.
